Our Goals

Our program will consist of an Introductory Level synchronized skating team. Skaters at this level are able to learn the skills and gain valuable experience, which will allow them to decide if they want to continue on to a more advanced level. The main emphasis is on learning new skills, teamwork, making new friends, and having fun. The team will have one scheduled practice session each week, every Sunday evening from 6:00pm to 6:45pm.

Who is Eligible to Skate?

Any USFS skater can skate with our synchronized team regardless of their “Home” club. We want to provide this opportunity to ALL area skaters who might be interested in participating in a synchronized skating program.

How Do I Get On The Team?

Tryouts for the Synchronized Skating team will be held on the first scheduled synchronized skating session, on Sunday, September 16th, from 6:00pm to 6:45pm. The coach will choose the team from skaters who participate. No special attire is needed for this; skaters should just bring their enthusiasm.

What If I Make The Team?

Skaters making the team will be required to make a deposit on the first day of practice. There will be costs associated with ice time, coaching, and costumes, which are not covered by the regular club membership fees. These costs are split between all members of the team.
